1.3 This is a four year pilot. NHS England can only reimburse practices for staffing costs for the clinical pharmacists. Funding will go via the CCG to the practices. We recognise that practices may take a few weeks to recruit their pharmacists and so we will offer a window of reimbursement.

NHS England will part fund the pharmacists for 36 months*

- 60% for the first 12 months of employment
- 40% for the second 12 months of employment
- 20% for the third 12 months of employment
- 0% after the first 36 months of support.

Where pharmacists are recruited after 31/03/2016 the 60% funding will only be available until 31/03/2017.

- An increase in the availability of GPs to undertake more complex chronic care from benchmark set by Practice.
- Improved access to GP and wider workforce, (extra appointments, decreased waiting times, patient satisfaction).
- Change in behaviours of patients with LTC and measure of patient experience.
- Description of climate, culture and context of practice.
- Improved communication between GP, community pharmacy and hospital pharmacy on admission, discharge and other interfaces of care.
- Improvement of number of reviews of medication in patients with dementia and learning difficulty / special needs.
- Repeat dispensing in line with medicines optimisation dashboard.
- Medications reviewed in more patients who have been discharged from hospital than from baseline provided by practice.
- A reduction in the admission rate for COPD from baseline provided by practice.
- A reduction in the CHD risk of patients with high risk for CHD from baseline provided by practice or improved assessment and care planning if high risk definition is inappropriate.
- Improvement on baseline provided by practice of number of patients seen by clinical pharmacist with Hypertension having a blood pressure of <150/90 for example improved proportion of people with uncontrolled hypertension (180/100+) brought below the uncontrolled threshold.
- An improvement from baseline provided by practice of house bound/ nursing home patient medications reviewed by the clinical pharmacist subject to the size of local population. (focus on frail elderly or 8+ repeat meds and reviews)

- An improvement from baseline provided by practice of all diabetics have a medication review with the clinical pharmacist.
- Patient feedback on the experience of general practice and in particular the clinical pharmacist..
